Scripture Commentary by Dianne Bergant CSA



The 'wisdom of Solomon' is well known even by those unfamiliar with most of the biblical tradition. The passage read today explains the origin of that wisdom. It reports an exchange between God and the king. The encounter took place in a dream, an avenue believed to be a vehicle of divine revelation. It is God who initiates the exchange, inviting Solomon to request whatever he desires. No reason is given for God's generosity. That in itself is a point to remember. God gives because God is generous. Solomon asks for an 'understanding heart' with which to rule his people. He makes a wise choice and receives the blessings that flow from it.

The psalm glorifies the law of the Lord. Almost every verse contains the word 'law', or a synonym of it. This demonstrates the reverence in which the law was held. The word 'law' (tôrâ), which really means "instruction', refers to the directives given to the people to enable them to live life appropriately. We miss the true meaning of the law if we do not situate it squarely within the theology of covenant which emphasises God's lovingkindness and compassion. Only then can we appreciate the goodness of God who has not only invited us into covenant, but has also shown us how we can faithfully live this covenant out commitment.

Two significant themes are found in Paul's Letter to the Romans: The first theme does not suggest that 'everything will work out in the end'. Rather, it suggests a profound trust in God who can bring good, even when adverse circumstances are not altered. The second theme, predestination, also often misunderstood. It claims that even before the beginning of time, God knew the plan that would bring all things to their final conclusion. Paul does not suggest that some are predestined to salvation and others to perdition. Rather, he argues that God calls all to conformity to the image of God's son. It is this conformity that justifies them, and their justification will be the source of their glorification.

Jesus continues to teach his disciples about the kingdom of God. The parables of the treasure in the field and the pearl point to the hidden character of the kingdom as well as its inestimable value. The parable of the net treats the diverse composition of kingdom's membership. Its eschatological character is seen in the mention of the end of the age and the role of the angels at the final judgment, when the good will be separated from the evil. Jesus considers his disciples interpreters of the law, disciples of the kingdom. Just as a householder brings out treasures old and new, so they understand that Jesus' teaching is grounded in the original tradition, yet it is radically different.

1 Kings 3:5.7-12

The Lord appeared to Solomon in a dream and said, 'Ask what you would like me to give you.' Solomon replied, 'Lord, my God, you have made your servant king in succession to David my father. But I am a very young man, unskilled in leadership. Your servant finds himself in the midst of this people of yours that you have chosen, a people so many its numbers cannot be counted or reckoned. Give your servant a heart to understand how to discern between good and evil, for who could govern this people of yours that is so great?' It pleased the Lord that Solomon should have asked for this. 'Since you have asked for this' the Lord said 'and not asked for long life for yourself or riches or the lives of your enemies, but have asked for a discerning judgement for yourself, here and now I do what you ask. 'Have you understood all this?' They said, 'Yes.' And he said to them, 'Well, then, every scribe who becomes a disciple of the kingdom of heaven is like a householder who brings out from his storeroom things both new and old.'
