#### **New Testament Commentary Mary Coloe PBVM**



While still on his journey to Jerusalem, Jesus offers his disciple a model of prayer. God is addressed in the same personal, trusting way that a child has, with utter confidence in its parent. In traditional Jewish manner, the prayer begins with the sanctification of God's holy name and the longing that God's reign would soon break into this world. The disciple is then taught to pray for a sustenance that only God can provide; that each day we may receive what we truly need for our journey. The disciple knows the reality of sin even within the Christian community. Sin is not to be a cause of despair or a permanent barrier. Sin is the condition from which we know our need of God as we ask constantly for forgiveness and are ready constantly to forgive. Finally, the disciple prays that in the times of trial, as we await the final arrival of God's reign of peace and justice, we will endure with the help of God.

This prayer has its basis in the Jewish prayer of Jesus' time. Sanctifying the name of God means recognising God as creator and observing God's commandments. Jesus' prayer resonates with the following examples of Jewish Synagogue prayer:

'May God's great Name be magnified and sanctified in the ages, which he has created. May God usher in the reign of his kingdom and bring about redemption... May the name of the holy One be blessed,

celebrated, glorified, exalted, praised, chanted, and raised on high.' (From the Qaddish) Another part of the Jewish daily prayer from that time had a series of blessings: 'You are holy and your Name is steadfast. There is no other god beside you.

Grant us, our Father, knowledge of you, the understanding, and discernment of your Law.

Forgive us, our Father, for we have sinned against you. Wipe away and take away our sins from your eyes for your mercy is great.

Bless for us, Lord our God, this year with abundance, and bring about the final year of our redemption. Shower dew and rain upon the face of the earth. Fill the world with the gifts of your kindness and bless the work of our hands.' (From the Amidah).

One Jewish prayer was originally composed in Aramaic, the usual language of Jews living in Palestine in the first century – the language of Jesus.

'Blessed be His great Name from age to age In the world He created by His will. May God establish his Kingdom During your life and during your days...'

The prayer we know as 'The Our Father' draws upon such prayers and concepts from 1st century Judaism.

The parable that follows offers the certainty that God will respond to prayer, as surely as a friend will get up and provide bread when a traveller comes to the village.

In this teaching, Jesus reveals that the essence of prayer lies in our relationship with God. Our utter neediness makes an irrefusable claim on God. What hinders prayer is a forgetfulness that God is our creator and that all we are, and all we have is gift. In prayer, we acknowledge who we are and who God is for us, and such habits of prayer are the basis for a constant sense of being in relationship with God.

Genesis 18:20-32

The Lord said, 'How great an outcry there is against Sodom and Gomorrah! How grievous is their sin! I propose to go down and see whether or not they have done all that is alleged in the outcry against them that has come up to me. I am determined to know.'

The men left there and went to Sodom while Abraham remained standing before the Lord. Approaching him he said, 'Are you really going to destroy the just man with the sinner? Perhaps there are fifty just men in the town. Will you really overwhelm them, will you not spare the place for the fifty just men in it? Do not think of doing such a thing: to kill the just man with the sinner, treating just and sinner alike! Do not think of it! Will the judge of the whole earth not administer justice?' The Lord replied, 'If at Sodom I find fifty just men in the town, I will spare the whole place because of them.'

Abraham replied, 'I am bold indeed to speak like this to my Lord, I who am dust and ashes. But perhaps the fifty just men lack five: will you destroy the whole city for five?' 'No', he replied 'I will not destroy it if I find forty-five just men there.' Again Abraham said to him, 'Perhaps there will only be forty there.' 'I will not do it' he replied 'for the sake of the forty.'

Abraham said, 'I trust my Lord will not be angry, but give me leave to speak: perhaps there will only be thirty there.' 'I will not do it' he replied 'if I find thirty there.' He said, 'I am bold indeed to speak like this, but perhaps there will only be twenty there.' 'I will not destroy it' he replied 'for the sake of the twenty.' He said, 'I trust my Lord will not be angry if I speak once more: perhaps there will only be ten.' 'I will not destroy it' he replied 'for the sake of the ten.'

#### Gospel

Luke 11:1-13

Once Jesus was in a certain place praying, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said, 'Lord, teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples.' He said to them, 'Say this when you pray:

"Father, may your name be held holy, your kingdom come; give us each day our daily bread, and forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive each one who is in debt to us. And do not put us to the test."

He also said to them, 'Suppose one of you has a friend and goes to him in the middle of the night to say, "My friend, lend me three loaves, because a friend of mine on his travels has just arrived at my house and I have nothing to offer him"; and the man answers from inside the house, "Do not bother me. The door is bolted now, and my children and I are in bed; I cannot get up to give it to you." I tell you, if the man does not get up and give it him for friendship's sake, persistence will be enough to make him get up and give his friend all he wants.

'So I say to you: Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened to you. For the one who asks always receives; the one who searches always finds; the one who knocks will always have the door opened to him. What father among you would hand his son a stone when he asked for bread? Or hand him a snake instead of a fish? Or hand him a scorpion if he asked for an egg? If you then, who are evil, know how to give your children what is good, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!'

#### **Reflection for Young People**

Jesus teaches us to ask, to seek, and to knock. If we do, we are promised that we shall receive, we shall find, and doors will be opened for us.

Does this mean that prayers are a type of magic and that all we have to do is pray and we can control the outcome of the world? If not, what do you think it means?

Jesus teaches us to pray: 'Forgive us our sins, for we too forgive all who do us wrong.'

Is there anyone who has done you wrong whom you cannot forgive? What gets in the way of your forgiveness?

If all our sins are forgiven anyway, why should we even try to resist temptation? Why not just continue to sin if we can always be forgiven?

What would Jesus say to that proposition?
