New Testament Commentary Mary Coloe PBVM



As a child, I thought that had I lived 2000 years ago and had the chance to see and hear Jesus then faith would have been so much easier. I'd have certainly believed! That's not what the Gospels say. Many people who witnessed the deeds and heard the words of Jesus did not come to faith in him. Faith isn't a matter of seeing, or hearing. Faith is about loving. It's risking one's whole life for another. This is the normal sort of faith on which we base our human friendships and commitments, and religious faith is similar. The disciples ask that their faith might be increased, but notice that Jesus puts the responsibility back onto them. Faith and love increase by daily living them, by daily putting them into action.

The parable shows faith in action by taking a common image from Jesus' time when a household would have servants. The parable suggests that faith is not what we want God to do for us; faith is about our being and doing for God. It is enough for us to live within the bounty of God's goodness and to respond to that goodness by generous service. Isn't that what it is like when people are in love? They are not asking, 'What will the other do for me?' but rather, 'How can I respond to this experience of love?' As a lover loves and a

believer believes, so servants express their identity in serving. At the end of the day the disciple simply says, 'I have done no more than my duty, I have lived my faith.'

'Fan into a flame the gift God gave you.' As I read or listen to these words their urgency challenges me. What is my gift? What particular way has God gifted me? Often I look at other people and their gifts are obvious — they can sing, or lead, or have a way of making friends easily, or a sharp mind. In fact by comparison with others it can sometimes be hard to see or value God's gift to me. Perhaps today my response to this reading is to take some quiet time alone and in silence open my heart to God, asking for wisdom to see clearly.

When I was teaching in school there was a poster in my room that read – God doesn't make junk! Whether we know it or not each of us is a precious part of God's creation and Timothy is right in wanting us all to be contributors. Quite a few of the Gospel sayings have a similar theme don't hide your light under a bushel; the woman who gives a small penny but is praised for contributing all. The other side of Timothy's urgent teaching is not just to recognise my gifts, but to put them to work - to fan them into a blazing flame. Gifts are not things to be cherished for oneself, but are meant to draw us out to others in some way.

In my own ministry I have a great love of the Scriptures. In this, and in the opportunities I have had to deepen my knowledge of them, I feel deeply blessed.

Timothy says, I have 'been trusted to look after something precious,' but in a paradoxical way, to guard this precious gift, I need to be open and share it with others. Here, the image of a flame is helpful. If a small flame is alight inside a closed room, it will stay small — but if you open the door or window, then it will blaze up to life.

Habakkuk 1:2-3: 2:2-4

How long, Lord, am I to cry for help while you will not listen; to cry 'Oppression!' in your ear and you will not save? Why do you set injustice before me, why do you look on where there is tyranny? Outrage and violence, this is all I see, all is contention, and discord flourishes.

Then the Lord answered and said,

'Write the vision down, inscribe it on tablets to be easily read, since this vision is for its own time only: eager for its own fulfilment, it does not deceive; if it comes slowly, wait, for come it will, without fail. See how he flags, he whose soul is not at rights, but the upright man will live by his faithfulness.'

Would he not be more likely to say, "Get my supper laid; make yourself tidy and wait on me while I eat and drink. You can eat and drink yourself afterwards"? Must he be grateful to the servant for doing what he was told? So with you: when you have done all you have been told to do, say, "We are merely servants: we have done no more than our duty.

Reflection for Young People

Jesus is telling the Apostles how small their faith actually is. If their faith were bigger – as big as the size of a tiny seed, for example – they could command trees to fly through the air and land in the sea! So obviously he must consider their faith to be very small indeed.

How about your faith? Do you think it is large or small? Why?

What influences affect your faith? Has any life experience of yours increased your faith? What happened?

Has any life experience hurt your faith and caused you to have doubts about God? What happened?

Not only does Jesus expect the Apostles to do great things with their faith, but to also see these miracles as 'no big deal' – as if they were to say: 'It was nothing. We were just doing our job.'

Have you ever done anything that impressed someone else, yet you yourself didn't think it was such a big deal? What was it that you did?

Have you ever seen someone do something that impressed you, yet to that person it was no big deal? What did that person do?

Do you believe that having more faith – in God, in yourself, in the power that comes from the Holy Spirit – could really cause miracles to occur? Why or why not?


