Scripture Commentary by Dianne Bergant CSA



The God of Israel addresses Cyrus, the Persian king, instructing him to release the Israelites from captivity in Babylon so that they can return home and rebuild their temple (see Ezra 1:1-8). Cyrus is called God's anointed, a title ascribed to Davidic kings. Cyrus was called even though he did not know the God of Israel. Here we see God working through people without their knowing that it is God who directs the events of history. Cyrus the foreigner is the agent of the release of the Israelites, but their release is for the enlightenment of the foreign nations. The phrase, 'I am the Lord, there is no other', seems to be God's primary self-identification (see Dt 4:35, 39; I Kgs 8:6)

Twice the psalmist calls for praise of God for the wonderful deeds that God has performed (vv.1, 3), each time highlighting a different aspect of the song. First, the song is to be new, suggesting that the old ways have passed away. Some kind of transformation has taken place. Second, it is directed to all the earth or all the lands (vv.1, 9). 'Earth' can mean both the natural world and human society. Everything is called to praise God, who is acclaimed king, creator and judge. The glory of God refers to the visible manifestation of God's splendour. While it is usually revealed in the temple (v.8),

here it is also associated with the wondrous deeds that God has accomplished.

In the First letter to the Thessalonians, Paul writes in his own name and in the names of two missionary companions, Silvanus and Timothy. He tells the Thessalonians how grateful missionaries are for their fidelity to the gospel that was preached to them. Theirs is an active faith, one that produces fruits, especially love. Having praised them, Paul reminds the Thessalonians of the circumstances of their conversion. They accepted the gospel though his preaching, but also through the power of the Holy Spirit. They had the example of the missionaries to strengthen them, but it was divine power that grounded them. Though spiritual children of Paul and his companions, they really belong to God.

The issue in the gospel reading is the possibility of being faithful both to God and to a secular state. The Pharisees did not approve of Gentile rule over the Jewish people. The Herodians, on the other hand, were Roman loyalists. The vehemently opposed occupation, while many others had made their peace with it and sometimes even benefited from it. Roman taxation was an issue that could easily cause people to take sides. It was with this very issue that the Pharisees hoped to ensnare Jesus, but Jesus outwits them. Besides exonerating himself from possible political or religious reproach, Jesus' response suggests that one can indeed be loyal to both a religious tradition and a secular power.

Tell us your opinion, then. Is it permissible to pay taxes to Caesar or not?' But Jesus was aware of their malice and replied, 'You hypocrites! Why do you set this trap for me? Let me see the money you pay the tax with.' They handed him a denarius, and he said, 'Whose head is this? Whose name?' 'Caesar's' they replied. He then said to them, 'Very well, give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar — and to God what belongs to God.'

Reflection for Young People By Lisa Marie Calderone-Stewart

The Pharisees and the Herodians try to trip Jesus up, but he won't fall for their setup. They ask him to choose between the worldly and the holy, between the political and the religious. Jesus simply says that we need to give to each what is due to each.

- Do you ever experience a conflict between what your faith says and what your country says? If something is legal, is it always moral? And if something is moral, is it always legal? What is an example of such a conflict?
- Do you ever experience a conflict between what your civil community says and what your faith community says? If something is an acceptable practice in your school or in your circle of friends, does that mean it's always right to do? And is the right thing always acceptable in your social situation? What is an example of such a conflict? Some people try to live entirely in one arena, and they are totally against the other.
- Do you know anyone who completely rejects all religion and talk of God and only clings to the physical, modern world? What is that attitude like?
- Do you know anyone who completely rejects all earthly things and clings only to the religious and spiritual? What is that attitude like?
- Do you know anyone who lives a good balance of both the spiritual and the earthly? What is that attitude like?
