New Testament Commentary by Brendan Byrne SJ



The Gospel today uses a technique we see in films of moving from a wide-angle panorama to a narrower-focussed single character. It begins in Caesar's Rome, and then moves to the region of Judea governed by Pilate, then to a smaller state, Galilee, with a puppet king Herod and his priests, Annas and Caiaphas. Having rolled all these 'credits' past our eyes we then meet the principal actor - the Word of God. Kings and governors are only background players in Luke's story. His focus is on God and the 'little ones' of this world through whom God can act. These introductory verses show Luke's interest in history – not for the sake of a historical record, but for the sake of Luke's particular theology. Luke will show the continuity between God's actions in the past and what God did during the time of Jesus, and what God is now doing in the time of the Church. History is an aspect of Luke's theological agenda!

John appears in the barren hills of the Judean wilderness calling the people of Israel to repent, and through baptism to express their desire for cleansing from sin. Scholars know from their excavations that the people of Israel practised ritual bathing before they entered the Temple. The cleansing waters prepared them to come before God. John's baptism is similar. He invites people to be prepared, for God is coming to them as Saviour.

Luke cites a Scripture passage from Isaiah. This passage expresses the prophet's hope during the time of the Exile in Babylon that God will soon come to act and redeem the people and bring them back to their own land. The passage he quotes is from the opening of Isaiah chapter 40 which begins with a message of consolation.

'Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that she has served her term, that her penalty is paid, that she has received from the LORD's hand double for all her sins.

A voice cries out: "In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD, make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. Then the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the LORD has spoken."

One of the issues facing the early Christians was the relationship between Jesus and John the Baptist. John was popular and had disciples who continued to preach his message even after John's death. It seems some were wondering who was the greater figure, Jesus or John. Luke looks back to the prophet Isaiah to present a theology that John was simply the one preparing the way for Jesus. He was the voice 'in the wilderness' as Isaiah had prophesied. Luke is therefore making a comparison between the saving God of the Exile, with the saving God present in Jesus. The theme of continuity between how God acted in the past and the events happening now, is Luke's method to affirm that God is faithful. Israel's story can thus shed light on current experience.

That God keeps faith is also the message of Paul to the community of Philippi – the one who began this good work in you, will see that it is finished, or brought to completion, before the Day of Christ Jesus. In Paul, we also see the strong sense of 'End Time' hope that dominated early Christian theology.

First Reading

Baruch 5:1-9

Jerusalem, take off your dress of sorrow and distress, put on the beauty of the glory of God for ever, wrap the cloak of the integrity of God around you, put the diadem of the glory of the Eternal on your head: since God means to show your splendour to every nation under heaven, since the name God gives you for ever will be, 'Peace through integrity, and honour through devotedness'. Arise, Jerusalem, stand on the heights and turn your eyes to the east: see your sons reassembled from west and east at the command of the Holy One, jubilant that God has remembered them. Though they left you on foot, with enemies for an escort, now God brings them back to you like royal princes carried back in glory. For God has decreed the flattening of each high mountain, of the everlasting hills, the filling of the valleys to make the ground level so that Israel can walk in safety under the glory of God. And the forests and every fragrant tree will provide shade for Israel at the command of God; for God will guide Israel in joy by the light of his glory with his mercy and integrity for escort.

In the fifteenth year of Tiberius Caesar's reign, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judaea, Herod tetrarch of Galilee, his brother Philip tetrarch of the lands of Ituraea and Trachonitis, Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene, during the pontificate of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah, in the wilderness. He went through the whole Jordan district proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the sayings of the prophet Isaiah:

A voice cries in the wilderness; Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight. Every valley will be filled in, every mountain and hill be laid low, winding ways will be straightened and rough roads made smooth. And all mankind shall see the salvation of God.
