New Testament Commentary Mary Coloe PBVM



In November, we move closer to the end of this Liturgical Cycle and the readings direct our attention towards the future that we believe awaits us when Jesus returns at the end of time. In the early church, that was a very real expectation that believers would see this glorious day of Christ's return. As history has passed, the urgency of this longing has also decreased.

The letter to the Thessalonians is the earliest writing in the New Testament written by Paul in the early 50's, around twenty years after the death of Jesus. By this time Paul has been involved for some years in a mission beyond Judaism to the Gentiles. Thessalonica, in northern Greece is one of the places he visited on his missionary journey. encourages this community to continue in their faith while awaiting the coming of Jesus. You might notice that Paul indicates that he expects to be alive at this time of the second coming, for he writes that 'we shall all be gathered around him'. Since the letters to the Thessalonians are the earliest writings of Paul, this is one of the earliest times we find the name Jesus linked with two titles - Lord (Greek: kyrios) and Christ (Hebrew: messiah). Paul bring together titles from within Judaism (messiah) and (kyrios) from the Greco-Roman culture. The title 'Lord' (kyrios/ domine) was beginning to be applied to the Roman Emperor signifying his divine

honours, often with the sense of his far reaching authority. At the end of time, Jesus' Lordship over all will be revealed. When Paul speaks of 'the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ,' he uses another word borrowed from his culture — Parousia. This was a political word to describe the city's preparation for the arrival of the Emperor on his formal visitation of that city. Paul's words are very provocative; for Christians, Jesus is now our Lord, not the Emperor.

In Luke 19, Jesus is nearing the end of his long journey from Galilee, which began in Luke 9) to Jerusalem. Jericho is the last major place before the final stage of the walk up to Jerusalem. The story of Zacchaeus acts out the teaching of last Sunday's parable of God's mercy to the sinner, and repeats its message. Jesus comes to Jericho, and of all the people in that village, he singles out the one most in need, the senior tax collector. Jesus gives himself to Zacchaeus, just as he now is. He imposes no conditions and simply says, 'Come down, it is necessary that I stay at your house today.' The necessity is caused by Zacchaeus' neediness. Jesus responds to him and offers to eat with him, the village outcast. You can imagine how others might be feeling. Jesus' words to Zacchaeus are like the free ticket to Heaven I wrote about last week. In response to Jesus' offer Zacchaeus changes. He recognises the utter generosity of God and makes the only appropriate response, humble gratitude and generosity in return. In the gift, its reception and the generous response Jesus recognises Salvation has happened for Zacchaeus. He has that free ticket to

When Jesus says, 'I must stay' – or more literally, 'it is necessary that I stay at your house', this type of passive expression is referred to as 'the divine necessity'. Their state of need calls out to God to come to their aid. In our neediness and poverty may we continue to place our hope in the gracious generosity of God. In the words of the psalms, 'May God support the fallen, and raise up those bowed down.'

He was anxious to see what kind of man Jesus was, but he was too short and could not see him for the crowd; so he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree to catch a glimpse of Jesus who was to pass that way. When Jesus reached the spot he looked up and spoke to him: 'Zacchaeus, come down. Hurry, because I must stay at your house today.' And he hurried down and welcomed him joyfully. They all complained when they saw what was happening. 'He has gone to stay at a sinner's house' they said. But Zacchaeus stood his ground and said to the Lord, 'Look, sir, I am going to give half my property to the poor, and if I have cheated anybody I will pay him back four times the amount.' And Jesus said to him, 'Today salvation has come to this house, because this man too is a son of Abraham: for the Son of Man has come to seek out and save what was lost.'
