New Testament Commentary by Mary Coloe PBVM



As we near the end of the liturgical year the Gospel is stressing the importance of reading the signs. We do this in many aspects of ordinary life. We might watch the dollar to see if it is a good time to travel overseas. We keep an eye on the petrol gauge in our cars. We check the weather to know what to wear. Jesus uses the symbolism of his Jewish Scriptures to speak about the ending of this world and the coming of God's reign. He says, 'Read the signs.'

The imagery of the darkening of the sun and moon and the stars falling would be familiar to Jews at the time of Jesus. It was very standard symbolism for the ending of this age. In our scientific world, where we read in the papers about the collapse of giant stars, and black holes in the universe, when we hear this type of apocalyptic language, we might take Jesus' words literally, instead of understanding them within a 1st century cosmology. What these images describe is the ending of God's creative order. The same order that God created 'in the beginning' now comes to its conclusion.

According to Jewish theology at that time, this world was now under the dominion of an evil power, so much so that God's Spirit could not break through; God's will could not be done on earth. The many years of oppression by Greek and then Roman rulers led to this way of thinking. According to this theology, God would

need to intervene and bring this world, dominated by evil powers, to an end and then usher in a new creation, where God's Spirit could be freely poured out and God's will would prevail. This is what Jesus meant when he spoke about the Kingdom.

The Book of Daniel, a type of apocalyptic literature, describes the time when this world ends and God's reign begins. In his vision he speaks of one 'like a Son of Man' (7:13) being given dominion in God's new creation.

I saw in the night visions, and behold, with the clouds of heaven there came one like a son of man, and he came to the Ancient of Days and was presented before him. And to him was given dominion and glory and kingdom, that all peoples, nations, and languages should serve him; his dominion is an everlasting dominion, which shall not pass away, and his kingdom one that shall not be destroyed.

Jesus, as a Jew of his time, would know this theological thinking and the Book of Daniel, and he too believes that God's reign is about to break into this world. His own ministry of healing and exorcism testifies to the presence already of God's power. What people can see in his own life is the first budding forth of the Kingdom, about to break into full bloom. The fig tree, with its first leaves is an image of a fruitfulness about to appear. So his teaching has a sense of urgency to it.

Two thousand years later we no longer have an expectation of the immediate end of the world - except in science fiction. But we can certainly live in expectation and awareness of God's presence in our lives. We can live each day alert to discovering God just around the corner. How will I meet God today? Will it be in the face of an upset child? The listening of a friend? The unwanted interruption to my plans? The quiet reflective moment in my day? God comes to us in so many various ways - if we can read the signs. The ancient world looked to cosmic signs to announce God's coming, but Jesus' parable of the lowly fig tree suggests we look to the ordinary and familiar.

Do you worry about the end of the world? If so, why? If not, why not?


When you hear talk about predictions of the end of time, how do you feel? What do you say? What do you think about?
