Scripture Commentary by Dianne Bergant CSA



The individual announcing this prophetic oracle has been anointed by the Lord and is thus endowed with the spirit. The anointing may be a figure of speech, but the duties that accompany it are very real and explicitly social. The afflicted referred to were probably victims of some social system. The good news promises that they will be the beneficiaries of the year of release, while the oppressive system will suffer the vengeance of God. The reading begins with a promise of salvation and ends with a prayer of thanksgiving for salvation granted. It contains several prophetic themes: God cares for the afflicted, saves through the agency of human beings, and fulfills promises; all things are accomplished through God's grace.

The psalm has strong parallels with the victory hymns of other women, Miriam (Exod 15:1-18), Hannah (1 Sam 2:1-10), and Judith (Jdt 16:1-17). In it, Mary praises God for the wonders that are being accomplished within her. Her own lowliness is evidence that the poor and downtrodden have been visited with salvation. The humility that acknowledged her lowliness does not deny the greatness of the things that will be accomplished through her. While the first verses describe the great things that God did to

Mary, the last ones list some of the past blessings enjoyed by Israel. Mary's hymn suggests that the marvels accomplished in her are a final example of God's mercy. The salvation of the people has finally come.

Paul urges the Christians to be unceasing in rejoicing, prayer, and thanksgiving. He does not overlook the realities of suffering in life, nor does he advocate a false sense of happiness that simply refuses to let in anything that is painful. The joy that he urges is the joy that comes from knowing that in Christ's resurrection, even death itself has been overcome. Paul suggests the presence of charismatic or spirit-filled activity. He encourages the Thessalonians to give full rein to the gifts of the spirit, while discerning what is genuinely of God and what is not. He prays for their holiness and then assures them of God's faithfulness to the promises of salvation made to them.

'Who are you?' is the hinge question in the gospel reading. This is not a simple enquiry about name or occupation; it is a very concrete question. 'Who are you in relation to the Messiah?' The Baptist himself testifies to his relationship to the Messiah. He is the divinely chosen witness to the light, not the light itself. Messianic expectations were anything but uniform at this time. After he denies being any messianic figure, John identifies himself as 'a voice in the wilderness' (Isa 40:3). His role is preparatory; he explains this when the officials question his reasons for baptising. John is content to be first the witness, the herald, and nothing more.

Gardenina & General Maintenance of garden

Two of the church volunteers have reached retirement age and we are looking for volunteers to take over maintenance of the grounds and gardens.

It has been suggested that two mini working bees be conducted each month. One on the first and one on the third Saturday. If any parishioner is available on either of these two days each month, please place your name on the list in the foyer. Gospel

John 1:6-8. 19-28

A man came, sent by God. His name was John. He came as a witness, as a witness to speak for the light, so that everyone might believe through him. He was not the light, only a witness to speak for the light.

This is how John appeared as a witness. When the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, 'Who are you?' he not only declared, but he declared quite openly, 'I am not the Christ.' 'Well then,' they asked, 'are you Elijah?' 'I am not,' he said. 'Are you the Prophet?' He answered, 'No.' So they said to him, 'Who are you? We must take back an answer to those who sent us. What have you to say about yourself?' So John said, 'I am, as Isaiah prophesied:

a voice that cries in the wilderness: Make a straight way for the Lord.'

Now these men had been sent by the Pharisees, and they put this further question to him, 'Why are you baptising if you are not the

Christ, and not Elijah, and not the prophet?' John replied, 'I baptise with water; but there stands among you — unknown to you — the one who is coming after me; and I am not fit to undo his sandal-strap.' This happened at Bethany, on the far side of the Jordan, where John was baptising.
