New Testament Commentary Mary Coloe PBVM



Last Sunday's Gospel saw Jesus announce his goal in the Synagogue of Nazareth; today we see the reactions to his words. Jesus' message was, 'God keeps Jubilee. You are all welcomed home by a God who loves you.' Some are touched by this proclamation of a most gracious God but others, not surprisingly, are enraged. Judaism had a long tradition of law which spelled out quite clearly who was a righteous person, and who was a sinner, who was a person loved by God and who would God turn away from. The categories were clear. Good people tried to live out the Law and so feel themselves worthy to be loved by God. Sinners knew themselves and outcasts. worthless Jesus' proclamation cut through these presumptions. He announced a God who broke the rules set by Judaism. 'All are welcome; righteous and sinner alike. You are welcome not because you've made yourself worthy, not because you're better than others; you are welcome because God loves you – all of you.'

Jesus' words shocked and scandalised the good, religious people of his time. The God he was describing simply did not fit within their religious categories and so they mocked him, 'This is Joseph's son, what right does he have to speak like this?' Jesus' only defence is to point to the history of how his people treated other prophets. The prophet's hardest audience is his own people. Elijah and Elisha's greatest miracles were for foreigners, the outsiders.

In 1 Kings 17, Elijah heals the son of a Canaanite woman, living in Sidon, and in 2 Kings 5, Elisha is able to heal Naaman, the commander of the army of Syria. Here again we see Luke's interest in showing Jesus as one for those outside Israel remember Luke's community is probably made up of non-Jews.

If Jesus preached this message in our churches today what response would he receive? Who would listen and welcome his startling words? Who would be scandalised?

From the list of gifts in chapter 12 where the gift of tongues is last, it seems this was an exaggerated gift and greatly prized in the community since it was so visible and unusual. For Paul the gift of tongues is just like a gong or cymbal in an orchestra - it has a place, but on its own, it is very minor.

The use of nothing is important – without love I am no-thing, I have no existence - I have no life in Christ so no existence as God wants. You live in Christ in love. or vou have no real existence.

Even generosity and sacrifice counts for nothing if it is not done with love.

Paul then describes the attitude of love: love is patient, kind, not jealous, not boastful, not arrogant or rude ... Love lies in the attitude and not necessarily in the behaviour. I can act for all sorts of motives - to be seen, to be thought well of, to feel good, this is not love.

The list Paul gives relates to this community - from their rejoicing in wrongdoing of incest in chapter 5 (5:1-8); to their lack of patience and kindness to the weak in the issue of meat offered to idols in chapters 8-10.

The final verses return to the gifts mentioned in verses 1-3 (tongues, prophecy, knowledge) and the community is encouraged to move from childishness (see 3:1) to more mature Christian living.



Jeremiah 1:4-5. 17-19

In the days of Josiah, the word of the Lord was addressed to me, saying,

'Before I formed you in the womb I knew you; before you came to birth I consecrated you; I have appointed you as prophet to the nations. So now brace yourself for action. Stand up and tell them all I command you. Do not be dismayed at their presence, or in their presence I will make you dismayed. I, for my part, today will make you into a fortified city, a pillar of iron, and a wall of bronze to confront all this land: the kings of Judah, its princes, its priests and the country people. They will fight against you but shall not overcome you, for I am with you to deliver you – it is the Lord who speaks.'

Second Reading

1 Corinthians 12:31 – 13:13

Be ambitious for the higher gifts. And I am going to show you a way that is better than any of them.

If I have all the eloquence of men or of angels, but speak without love, I am simply a gong booming or a cymbal clashing. If I have the gift of prophecy, understanding all the mysteries there are, and knowing everything, and if I have faith in all its fullness, to move mountains, but without love, then I am nothing at all. If I give away all that I possess, piece by piece, and if I even let them take my body to burn it, but am without love, it will do me no good whatever.

Love is always patient and kind; it is never jealous; love is never boastful or conceited; it is never rude or selfish; it does not take offence, and is not resentful. Love takes no pleasure in other people's sins but delights in the truth; it is always ready to excuse, to trust, to hope, and to endure whatever comes.

Love does not come to an end. But if there are gifts of prophecy, the time will come when they must fail; or the gift of languages, it will not continue for ever; and knowledge – for this, too, the time will come when it must fail. For our knowledge is imperfect and our prophesying is imperfect; but once perfection comes, all imperfect things will disappear. When I was a child, I used to talk like a child, and think like a child, and argue like a child, but now I am a man, all childish ways are put behind me. Now we are seeing a dim reflection in a mirror; but then we shall be seeing face to face. The knowledge that I have now is imperfect; but then I shall know as fully as I am known.

In short, there are three things that last: faith, hope and love; and the greatest of these is love.

Jesus began to speak in the synagogue, 'This text is being fulfilled today even as you listen.' And he won the approval of all, and they were astonished by the gracious words that came from his lips.

They said, 'This is Joseph's son, surely?' But he replied, 'No doubt you will quote me the saying, "Physician, heal yourself" and tell me, "We have heard all that happened in Capernaum, do the same here in your own countryside."' And he went on, 'I tell you solemnly, no prophet is ever accepted in his own country.

'There were many widows in Israel, I can assure you, in Elijah's day, when heaven remained shut for three years and six months and a great famine raged throughout the land, but Elijah was not sent to any one of these: he was sent to a widow at Zarephath, a Sidonian town. And in the prophet Elisha's time there were many lepers in Israel, but none of these was cured, except the Syrian, Naaman.'

When they heard this everyone in the synagogue was enraged. They sprang to their feet and hustled him out of the town; and they took him up to the brow of the hill their town was built on, intending to throw him down the cliff, but he slipped through the crowd and walked away.
