### **New Testament Commentary by Mary Coloe PBVM**



If you recall, the issue Paul is dealing with in 1 Corinthians is that of divisions within the community. It seems that one group is emphasising their knowledge and wisdom, perhaps this is the group taught by Apollos. To counter this Paul emphasises that Christianity is not an idea, an intellectual exercise or ideology – it can't enshrined in worldly wisdom. be Christianity is based on a brute fact - a cross. Reducing the physical reality of Jesus' death to eloquent words empties the cross of its power. The Gospel cannot be presented intellectually; it must be demonstrated by flesh and blood people who live it out. The Christian minister says: 'If you want to know Christ and his values. look at me. Here and now I demonstrate in my life what Christianity is about.' Words do not substitute for living witnesses.

So Paul presents himself as one who came to teach them without great philosophical training in oratory, and stresses that his teaching focused on the reality of the cross. In coming to any letters of Paul you need to keep clearly in mind that in these letters we have Paul doing theology. Corinthians is not the best or most complete exposition of Paul's theology that comes in Romans. But in this letter we see a pastor dealing with real live people and their problems and taking these as the starting point reflecting on what the Christian message has to say to these specific concerns. He is constantly working out the meaning of the Christ event and

trying to relate this in sensible language that his audience in Corinth understand.

For Paul, the cross is the ultimate sign of God's love – a life of his beloved son given to us in love. Why did God act in this precise way? Why did God send the Christ as an ordinary human person, and most especially what purpose was served in his suffering and crucifixion? Why did God give us a Christ crucified? What was the Christ of God doing on the cross?

Paul's answer is that only the Cross could show us the overwhelming, ridiculous love of God. To the Greeks it is folly; to the Jews it is a scandal; but this is God's selfgiving to us.

To paraphrase what Paul is saying:

Dear Corinthians, you are being very foolish. I've heard you have different factions, a group for Apollos, a group for Peter, a group for Paul. This is nonsense. Did I save you? Did Apollos? Did Peter? No. You were given the gift of salvation in the death of Christ - the cross is what brings you freedom from the power of sin, not Paul, not Apollos, not Peter. You have set us up against each other as if we were competitors, engaging in a debate, trying to win you over to our side by our eloquence and our wisdom. What a foolish way of behaving. It is not our wisdom or the power of our words that matter; it is God's wisdom and God's power. Where do you see the wisdom and the power of God? The cross. What looks like absolute weakness is in fact God's power defeating the power of sin. Even though this looks utterly foolish by human standards, this is the wisdom of God, for only in this way could God show to us God's absolute love; that God is for us, on our side.

Light has many functions. It can offer comfort and solace. Light can drive out the shadows of fear. And light can also reveal what is hidden. The prophets of Israel were those who shone a light on Israel's failures to live up to their values as God's people. At other times they offered words of hope and guidance when Israel was plunged into despair.

### First Reading

Thus says the Lord:

Isaiah 58:7-10

Share your bread with the hungry, and shelter the homeless poor, clothe the man you see to be naked and turn not from your own kin. Then will your light shine like the dawn and your wound be quickly healed over.

Your integrity will go before you and the glory of the Lord behind you. Cry, and the Lord will answer; call, and he will say, 'I am here.'

If you do away with the yoke, the clenched fist, the wicked word, if you give your bread to the hungry, and relief to the oppressed, your light will rise in the darkness, and your shadows become like noon.

### Responsorial Psalm

(R.) A light rises in the darkness for the upright.

- He is a light in the darkness for the upright: he is generous, merciful and just. The good man takes pity and lends, he conducts his affairs with honour. (R.)

1 Corinthians 2:1-5

When I came to you, brothers, it was not with any show of oratory or philosophy, but simply to tell you what God had guaranteed. During my stay with you, the only knowledge I claimed to have was about Jesus, and only about him as the crucified Christ. Far from relying on any power of my own, I came among you in great 'fear and trembling' and in my speeches and the sermons that I gave, there were none of the arguments that belong to philosophy; only a demonstration of the power of the Spirit. And I did this so that your faith should not depend on human philosophy but on the power of God.

'You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill-top cannot be hidden. No one lights a lamp to put it under a tub; they put it on the lamp-stand where it shines for everyone in the house. Who has been light for you – who has helped bring you out of the darkness? How have you learned from this person? How did that learning take place?




## Manning Parish Youth Quest Youth Ministry
