New Testament Commentary by Mary Coloe PBVM



Last week we left the Corinthians in chapter two. This week we have leapt across to chapter three. You can see how difficult it is in the liturgy to develop Paul's line of thought when so much is left out. It would be like watching a football match and moving from the second quarter immediately to the last!

Last week Paul ended by speaking of a true wisdom that can only be given by God, and not by the philosophies of the world. He ends chapter two by saying that those who are unspiritual cannot receive the gifts of God's spirit and remain in foolishness. Then at the start of chapter three he writes crossly to them, calling them unspiritual, mere infants not ready yet to be fed solid food. The reason he speaks this way is that the community is divided into competing factions — as long as there is jealousy and quarrelling among you, you behave according to human inclination — not of the Spirit of God.

He then speaks of the various ministers, Apollos and himself as mere servants with each of them building upon the work of each other. They are not in competition — "I planted and Apollos watered, but only God gives the growth ... laid a foundation, and someone else is building on it.' These images lead into the reading today, as Paul describes what it is that is being built.

The community is called God's Temple because in the community the Spirit of God dwells.

In the light of Paul's message, today might provide an opportunity to reflect on the teaching of Vatican II that all Christians are called to holiness, that all are created in the image of God and have been gifted with the Spirit of God.

Matthew's Gospel continues Jesus' Sermon on the Mount, where, like Moses, Jesus teaches the community his code of behaviour. What he teaches sounds impossible, but it is what he lived and what some others have also been capable of living. Occasionally, in the midst of terrible wars and atrocities, we hear of people who have been able to rise above their own suffering and rage, to find in themselves the ability, the grace, of forgiveness.

When Matthew says, 'Be perfect as your heavenly Father is perfect', I think this means something like being a whole person. The Greek word used here is 'telos' and it has the sense of completion, of being whole, of having arrived at the end

With this is mind, Jesus' code of behaviour calls us to be whole people, and this is how we can also be holy people.

Recently I encountered a difficult student in class. His behaviour was poor and at times seemed out of control - he took no notice of my authority as the teacher. I found myself being filled with tension and rage, and of course saw that this student was the cause. When I prayed about this, I began to see that underneath my tension and rage was my own fear. I was afraid that I could not control him, and I was telling myself I should be able to. Eventually I came to see that this self-talk was wrong. There is no way that I can control any other adult, and nor should I see that as a good thing. If this person wanted to behave poorly then he would and all I could do was find my own inner peace with this. Praying with this led me to let go my fear, to be more at peace, and in fact this meant that I was much more at ease in dealing with this student than I had been when I was carrying such tension and



Didn't you realise that you were God's temple and that the Spirit of God was living among you? If anybody should destroy the temple of God, God will destroy him, because the temple of God is sacred; and you are that temple.

Make no mistake about it: if any one of you thinks of himself as wise, in the ordinary sense of the word, then he must learn to be a fool before he really can be wise. Why? Because the wisdom of this world is foolishness to God. As scripture says: The Lord knows wise men's thoughts: he knows how useless they are, or again: God is not convinced by the arguments of the wise. So there is nothing to boast about in anything human: Paul, Apollos, Cephas, the world, life and death, the present and the future, are all your servants; but you belong to Christ and Christ belongs to God.

Gospel

Matthew 5:38-48

Jesus said to his disciples: 'You have learnt how it was said: Eye for eye and tooth for tooth. But I say this to you: offer the wicked man no resistance. On the contrary, if anyone hits you on the right cheek, offer him the other as well; if a man takes you to law and would have your tunic, let him have your cloak as well. And if anyone orders you to go one mile, go two miles with him. Give to anyone who asks, and if anyone wants to borrow, do not turn away.

You have learnt how it was said: You must love your neighbour and hate your enemy. But I say this to you: love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you; in this way you will be sons of your Father in heaven, for he causes his sun to rise on bad men as well as good, and his rain to fall on honest and dishonest men alike. For if you love those who love you, what right have you to claim any credit? Even the tax collectors do as much, do they not? And if you save your greetings for your brothers, are you doing anything exceptional? Even the pagans do as much, do they not?

You must therefore be perfect just as your heavenly Father is perfect.'

Reflection for Young People By Lisa-Marie Calderone Stewart

The old law about taking 'an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth' was never meant to be a justification for excessive violence. It started out as a law limiting violence – take no more than a tooth for a tooth – because people were ready and willing to kill someone over a broken tooth. Jesus put a stop to that. To return violence for violence only continues its cycle, and it justifies violence instead of non-violence when settling conflicts.

- Why is the command 'Love your enemies' hard to follow?
- Why is our culture so familiar with methods of violence, yet so ignorant of methods of non-violent conflict resolution?
- What do you think might end the cycle of violence?
- If someone is angry and wishes to do physical harm to you, what are your nonviolent options?
- When it comes to choosing between violent and nonviolent methods, does gender make any difference? If so, why? If not, why not?
